WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. dedicated his life to bringing about social, political, and economic equality for all Americans by non-violent means, devoted his life to the struggle for justice and equality, sowing seeds of hope for a day when all people might claim "the riches of freedom and the security of justice," and challenged our Nation to recognize that our individual liberty relies upon our common equality; and

"Smithville City Council bids fare well to Mayor Saunders, will appoint a new Mayor in January"

Smithville, Texas – December 29, 2020 – Mayor Scott Saunders, Jr., who has served as the City of Smithville's Mayor, has submitted his letter of resignation to city officials. "It is with a great sense of honor, gratitude, and tremendous sadness that I am officially announcing my resignation as Mayor of the City of Smithville Effective January 11, 2021." Saunders, the youngest elected official to serve the central Texas community of almost 4,000, was elected to the City Council in 2012, and later elected to serve as Mayor in 2016. Saunders expressed his heartfelt appreciation to the community, his family, the Smithville Chamber of Commerce, city staff, his fellow elected officials, and City Manager Robert Tamble for allowing him to serve his community in such a tremendous capacity over the last nine years. "I would like to thank Scott Saunders, Jr. for his dedication and service to our community. During his tenure as Councilmember and Mayor, Scott helped the community respond to (and recover from) devastating fires, floods, and a global pandemic. I will miss his leadership," said City Manager Robert Tamble. During his tenure, Mayor Saunders helped develop and implement strategic plans that allowed infrastructure improvement and economic development without jeopardizing the small town' look, charm, and feel according to Tamble.

Mayor Saunders shared an outgoing farewell message online today expressing his sentiments and details regarding his resignation. "I am leaving the community and the City of Smithville in better shape then I found them," said Saunders, "I am extremely humbled and grateful to have been able to contribute so meaningfully to my hometown, but it is time for me to focus on my family, my small business, and my personal life." In his video message he also applauded the work that the Chamber of Commerce and community leaders have done and will continue to do moving forward. The mayoral seat is an ex officio member on the Chamber's Board of Directors, therefore Mayor Saunders and the Chamber worked closely on multiple initiatives involving organizational policy and shaping the vision alongside its many community focused programs. The Smithville Area Chamber of Commerce Director, April Daniels stated, "It has been my great honor to work with Mayor Scott Saunders over the past seven years. He has proven to be an amazing public servant, always striving to do what he felt was beneficial for the people of Smithville."

As Mayor Saunders transitions to the private sector, he looks forward to continuing to be able to contribute to the community through his time, talents, and energies. Mayor Saunders owns Scott Saunders Farmers Insurance on Main Street in historic downtown Smithville. He is looking forward to spending more time there and with his wife and two young daughters in the coming months. Mayor Pro Tem Joanna Morgan said this about Saunders "His combination of youthful -PAGE 1-

energy, maturity, and his experience serving the community in so many diverse ways made him an exceptional Mayor, and one well suited for the current times. The progress we have made in economic development and in working together as a community have been greatly supported by his strong and caring leadership."

Per state law the City Council will consider the appointment of Mayor Pro Tem Joanna Morgan to serve as Mayor for the remainder of Saunders term which ends in May 2021. This means that a current Council seat would need to be filled prior to the election. The process, as outlined in the local government code, additional calls for an appointee to be confirmed by the council to fill the vacancy caused from a current member assuming the duties of Mayor. In addition, the vacancy left by the Mayor's resignation, the Mayoral seat, will need to be filled in the general election this May. Also on the ballot will be Place 1 currently held by Sharon Forester, Place 2 currently held by Mike Kahanek, and Place 3 held by Bill Gordon. If a remaining council member decides to run for Mayor an additional council seat will be on the ballot. "Going forward, we have a very strong Mayor Protem and an effective City Council who will work together to ensure a seamless transition. We will continue to manage growth in a manner that preserves and protects our historic charm while enabling infrastructure improvement, economic development, and fiscal responsibility." Said Tamble. At the January 11<sup>th</sup> virtual City Council meeting Mayor Pro Tem Morgan will officially transition into her new role. "Scotty leaves big shoes to fill, however I am up for the challenge of serving our city and Smithville residents in this new role."

"Smithville is one of the most amazing places, I am so proud to call it home and run my business here, make memories with my wife, and raise my daughters. What makes it so awesome, is the amazing people that live here and the community we build with each other. Please continue to hold that love, compassion, and kindness towards one another in your hearts," said Mayor Scott Saunders, Jr.

Open Meeting: Call to order: Mayor Saunders called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Invocation: Robert Tamble gave the invocation.

Recognition/Awards/Proclamations/Announcements/Presentations: Mayor Saunders and Councilmembers signed their pledge for the "It's Time Texas Challenge".

### **Open Meeting:**

Council Discussion and Action on:

a. On a 10 ft side yard setback variance at 300 4th Avenue, Mount Pleasant Block 8 Lot 1, R17249, Owner Aaron Kimball: Mr. Kimball would like a 5-ft side yard setback instead of the 15-ft requirement for an SF-2 corner lot. Three (3) citizens submitted letters to the P&Z against approving the variance. Mr. Kimball responded and assured he understands the neighbor's concerns. Councilwoman Foerster made a motion to approve the Variance. Councilman Gordon seconded the motion and the vote was:

Against: Morgan

- b. On a minor re-plat at 216 & 218 Washington St., Townsite Block 70 Lots 19 & 20, (R20266 & R20262) Owner- Ramon Oscar Gonzales, agent Cynthia Gonzales:Mr. Gonzales would like to consolidate two parcels into one. Councilman Gordon made a motion to approve the re-plat. Councilwoman Morgan seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
- c. On a minor re-plat at 301 San Jacinto, Smithville City Block 89 lot 1 & ½ of 2 (R20790) Owner- Michael and Danielle Davis: Mr. and Mrs. Davis would like to split 1-1/2 lots into two (2) separate lots so they can build two new homes. This will require a minimum lot size variance to allow the two homes to be built. The property is currently zoned SF-2 and the minimum lot size requirement is 6500 ft². Mr. and Mrs. Davis are seeking a variance of approximately 250 ft². Councilwoman Bruno made a motion to approve the variance and re-plat. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

### Citizen Comments on:

Discussion and Action on a 380 Economic Development Agreement between Dan Vogler/CEO-Pentric, Inc. (Smithville Solar One, LLC) and the City of Smithville: Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes municipalities to offer incentives designed to promote economic development such as commercial and retail projects. The terms of this 380 Agreement require Pentric and Smithville Solar One, LLC to voluntarily annex a 20.93-acre tract of land into the city limits. The land will be used to construct a phased solar energy development with the intent to sell solar electricity to the City of Smithville pursuant to the terms included in the Solar Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) previously executed on 12/9/2019. In return, the City of Smithville will provide services (e.g., fire, police, garbage, water, and sewer) and offer approximately \$30k of performance-based incentives in the form of property tax reimbursements over the next 5-years. The cost of the incentives will be offset by the savings generated from the PPA. Councilman Gordon made a motion to approve the 380 Economic Development Agreement. Councilman Kahanek seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a Service Plan Agreement with Dan Vogler/CEO-Pentric, Inc. and the City of Smithville on 20.767 acres situated in the Thomas DeCrow Survey, A-27, and 2,093 square feet within a proposed ingress/egress easement tract situated in the Thomas DeCrow Survey, A-27, Tract 4B, Acres 0.163 in Bastrop County Texas: Pursuant to Texas Local Government Cod 43.0672, the City shall identify and provide mutually-agreed municipal services within 60-days of annexation. Mr. Dan Vogler (property owner) has agreed to the terms and conditions of the Service

Plan Agreement. Approving the service agreement is a pre-requisite for annexation. Councilwoman Morgan made a motion to approve the Service Agreement. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action to Adopt an Ordinance to Annex 20.767 acres situated in the Thomas DeCrow Survey, A-27, and 2,093 square feet within a proposed ingress/egress easement tract situated in the Thomas DeCrow Survey, A-27, Tract 4B, Acres 0.163 in Bastrop County Texas Owner- Dan Vogler/CEO-Pentric, Inc.: Approving this ordinance will authorize annexation of the property into the city limits. Councilwoman Bruno made a motion to approve the Ordinance to Annex. Councilman Kahanek seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a Resolution to support The Willows Apartments rehabilitation of affordable rental housing and financial support in the amount of \$250.00: A developer (ARX Advantage) is seeking funding (IRS tax credits) from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHSC) to rehabilitate/refurbish the Willows Apartments. The developer needs a resolution of support and a \$250 waiver or reduction of fees from the City. Approval of this resolution will help the developer attain a higher application score. If TDHCA funds are awarded, the Willows Apartments will undergo a much-needed construction upgrade. Councilman Kahanek made a motion to approve the Resolution. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a License Agreement for an Encroachment onto City Property at 202 Main Street for an awning, owner-Marcela Foutel: Marcela Foutel would like to replace the awning at 202 Main that encroaches approximately 8-feet onto City property. The existing encroachment (awning) was conveyed with the sale of the property. However, the City has no record of entering into a license agreement with the previous owner. Councilwoman Bruno made a motion to approve the License Agreement. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Hear recommendation from Historic Preservation and Design Standards Advisory Committee (HPDS) on a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) request for Marcela Foutel at 202 Main Street, Smithville, TX: Sarah O'Brien (HPDS Chairwoman) said the HPDS Committee recommends approving the Certificate of Appropriateness.

Discussion and Action on a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) request for Marcela Foutel at 202 Main Street, Smithville, TX: The HPDS recommended approving the COA request for the awning at 202 Main Street with the condition that the structure meets ADA compliance (i.e., not interfere with the clear path of the sidewalk) and the support posts must be made from historic materials (i.e., not anodized aluminum). Councilwoman Morgan made a motion to approve the COA. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on the Financial Report: Councilman Kahanek made a motion to approve the Financial Report. Councilwoman Bruno seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

WHEREAS, after holding a due hearing, and having received the final report of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the City Council of the City of Smithville has determined that amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Smithville, Texas as set forth herein will further the health, welfare, and safety of the public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SMITHVILLE, TEXAS THAT:

- 1. **Findings of Fact.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.
- **Enactment.** Section 2.2.11 of the Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 14, Code of Ordinances of the City of Smithville, Texas are amended in accordance with Exhibit A, attached hereto.
- 3. Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or are inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matter regulated herein.
- 4. Severability. Should any section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause or phrase be held to be invalid for any reason, such holding shall not render invalid any other section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause, or phrase of this ordinance and same are deemed severable for this purpose.

### **EXHIBIT A**

The Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 14, Code of Ordinances of the City of Smithville, Texas is amended in accordance with this Exhibit A. Insertions are indicated with underlines (e.g. underlines) and deletions are indicated by strikethroughs (e.g. strikethroughs).

- 1. Section 3.3 Open Space. Section 3.3 Open Space is amended as follows:
  - (A) Section 3.3.3 is amended to read as follows:
    - 3.3.3. Open eaves, cornices, window sills, and belt courses may project into any required yard a distance not to exceed three (3) feet. Open uncovered porches or open fire escapes may project into a front or rear yard a distance not to exceed ten (10) feet. Fences, walls, and hedges in residential districts may be erected in any required yard or along the edge of any yard, providing that no fence, wall or hedge located in front of the front building line shall exceed four (4) feet in height, and no other wall or fence shall exceed eight (8) feet in height.
  - (B) Section 3.3.7 is amended to read as follows:
    - Any fence or enclosure extending closer than twenty-five (25) feet to the front-line street shall not exceed a height of four (4) feet, and any fence, hedge, or enclosure wall on a corner lot, which is situated within fifteen (15) feet of the intersection of the two (2) street lines, shall not exceed a height of three (3) feet. An attached or detached private garage which faces on a street shall not be located closer than twenty-five (25) feet to the public right of way.
- 2. Section 3.6 Fences and Walls. Section 3.6 Fences and Walls is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
  - 3.6 Fences and Walls
  - 3.6.1 Barbed Wire Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to make, build, construct, or erect any fence to be composed wholly or in part of metal fencing wire constructed with sharp edges or points arranged at intervals along the strands, such as barbed wire, razor wire, or concertina wire, on or along the line of any street, alley, avenue, sidewalk, land or lot in the City of Smithville; provided, however, that such wire may be used at a minimum height of 5 feet along the tops of fences along the lines of alleys.

### 3.6.2. Maximum Height of Residential Fences

The maximum heights for fences, walls, hedges, and other enclosures are as follows:

- (1) Within 15 feet of the intersection of two street lines on a corner lot, the maximum height is 3 feet.
- (2) Between the front building line and the public right of way on any lot, other than within 15 feet of the intersection of two street lines on a corner lot, the maximum height is 4 feet.
- (3) For all other portions of a lot, the maximum height of an ornamental fence that has a ratio of solid portion to open portion not in excess of one to four, not including a chain link or similar fence, is 8 feet and the maximum height of all other fences, walls, hedges, and other enclosures is 6 feet.

### 3.6.3. Masonry Walls

For commercial properties, industrial properties and community facilities, a masonry wall or other equivalent noise attenuating barrier shall be placed to separate all commercial, industrial and community uses and activities, including parking areas, from adjacent residential uses or property zoned SF-1, SF-2, TH, MF, MH or any other residential district.

### 3.6.4 Measurement.

The height of all fences, hedges, walls, and other enclosures is determined by measuring from the ground at the base of such fence, wall, hedge, or other enclosure.



We are asking the zoning committee to recommend the lots remain as they currently are, 3 city lots. The buyer of the property knew



### **ORDINANCE NO. 2021-603**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SMITHVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING EMERGENCY ORDINANCE #2020-599 DECLARING THAT A PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY EXISTS BECAUSE OF THE WORLD-WIDE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO THE POSTING OF A PUBLIC NOTICE BY COMMERCIAL ENTITIES AND THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS AND PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, the City Council is Extending the Effective date continuing through 11:59 p.m. on June 14, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SMITHVILLE, TEXAS THAT:

- 1. **Findings of Fact.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance# 2021-602 by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.
- 2. Enactment. Emergency Ordinance Declaring That A Public Health Emergency Exists Because Of The World-Wide Covid-19 Pandemic; Establishing Requirements Related to The Posting of A Public Notice By Commercial Entities And The Wearing Of Face Coverings of the City of Smithville, Texas are amended in accordance with Exhibit A, attached hereto.
- 3. Repealer. All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or are inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matter regulated herein.
- 4. Severability. Should any section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause, or phrase be held to be invalid for any reason, such holding shall not render invalid any other section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause, or phrase of this ordinance and same are deemed severable for this purpose.
- 5. **Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be effective as of the date of adoption.

### **EMERGENCY ORDINANCE # 2020-599**

THIS IS AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE DECLARING THAT A PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY EXISTS BECAUSE OF THE WORLD-WIDE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO THE POSTING OF A PUBLIC NOTICE BY COMMERCIAL ENTITIES AND THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS AND PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SMITHVILLE, TEXAS:

1.

### **DECLARATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY**

- 1.01 Pursuant to Sections 121.003 and 122.005 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, the City Council hereby declares that a public health emergency exists in the City of Smithville because of the world-wide novel coronavirus ("Covid-19") pandemic.
- 1.02 On March 13, 2020 Greg Abbott, Governor of Texas issued a disaster proclamation that Covid-19 poses an imminent threat of disaster for all counties in the State of Texas.
- 1.03 The Commissioner of the Texas Department of State Health Services has determined that Covid-19 continues to represent a public health disaster.
- 1.04 The Public Health Officer for Bastrop County, <u>Dr. Desmar Walkes</u>, has announced that Covid-19 continues to represent a serious public health disaster. <u>Dr. Desmar Walkes</u> is hereby appointed as the Public Health Officer for the City.

II.

### MANDATORY NOTICE FOR COMMERCIAL ENTITIES

- 2.01 Effective as of 11:59 a.m. on January 11, 2021, and continuing through 11:59 p.m. on June 14, 2021, all commercial entities in the city that provide goods or services directly to the public shall post a notice to the public that all employees and visitors to the commercial entity's business premises or other facilities are required to wear face coverings when in an area or performing an activity which will necessarily involve close contact or proximity to co-workers or the public, where six feet (6-ft) of separation is not feasible.
- 2.02 The aforesaid notice shall be posted in a conspicuous location sufficient to provide notice to employees and visitors of the health and safety requirements.

2.03 A sample Health and Safety Notice containing the minimum requirements is attached as Exhibit A and may be used by a commercial entity. A commercial entity may add its own additional requirements as determined by the entity.

### III.

### MANDATORY FACE COVERINGS FOR INDIVIDUALS

- 3.01 Except as provided below, **effective as of 11:59 a.m. on January 11, 2021, and continuing through 11:59 p.m. on June 14, 2021**, all persons 10 years or older shall wear a face covering over their nose and mouth when:
  - inside a commercial entity or other building open to the public, where it is difficult to keep six feet away from other persons or where working in areas that involve close proximity with other people or co-workers; or
  - b) outside with a group of people where it is difficult to keep six feet away from other persons in the group.
- 3.02 The requirement to wear face coverings in public does not apply to the following situations:
  - a) When exercising or engaging in physical activity;
  - b) When in a building that requires security surveillance or screening, such as banks;
  - c) While consuming food or drink;
  - d) When outside with a group of only members of a single household.
  - e) When doing so poses a mental or physical health, safety, or security risk as determined by a licensed physician or health care practitioner.

### IV

### **PENALTIES**

4.02 Any owner / agent of a commercial business entity or person violating this ordinance may receive a citation resulting in a fine not to exceed \$200.00 per violation.

### v

### **EXPIRATION DATE**

5.01 This Emergency Ordinance shall be automatically repealed on the sixty-first day following the day of its adoption, unless terminated sooner, or re-enacted by the Council.

### VI.

- 6.01 All ordinances, parts of ordinances, or resolutions in conflict herewith are expressly repealed.
- 6.02 The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.
- 6.03 The City Council hereby finds and declares that written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting at which this Emergency Ordinance was adopted was posted and that such meeting was open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Emergency Ordinance and the subject matter hereof were discussed, considered and formally acted upon, all as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.


