WHEREAS, the architectural design standards were created as guidelines for rehabilitation, redevelopment, maintenance, and preservation of its existing historic structures, and providing design standards for the development of new construction projects within the Smithville Historic Commercial District; and

WHEREAS, the city has established a historic marker program that encourages community members to designate their historic properties and/or significant events to recognize contributions from the past; and

WHEREAS, Smithville has a long-standing history and tradition of honors such as the first Film Friendly designation and a vibrant cultural arts district that is an officially designated Cultural Arts District which significantly enhances the historic fabric of our town; and

WHEREAS, since 1975, the Smithville Heritage Society has worked to preserve, protect and enrich the stories and histories of Smithville, through their archival records and research, the Heritage House Museum and Archives, special events and programming, and partnerships that showcase and support the historic fabric of the community; and

WHEREAS, May is National Historic Preservation Month, co-sponsored by the Smithville Heritage Society, the Smithville Historic Preservation/Design Standards Advisory Committee and the City of Smithville,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor of the City of Smithville, do hereby proclaim May 2023 as Historic Preservation Awareness Month, and call upon the people of Smithville to join their fellow citizens across the United States in recognizing and participating in this special observance.

Proclamation Honoring Bennie Lueders January 10, 1928 – April 23, 2023

WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council of the City of Smithville, from time to time, recognize citizens of Smithville who have distinguished themselves; and

WHEREAS, Bennie Lueders was one of seven (7) children born between Muldoon and Cistern, TX on January 10, 1928; and

WHEREAS, at the age of 17, Bennie joined the Coast Guard during WW II and he joined the Army during the Korean War. While in his 20's, he obtained his pilot's license and flew private planes achieving the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award for over 50 years of safe flying; and

WHEREAS, Bennie was a charter member of the Smithville Flying Club and the Friends of 84R. He led the effort to get the Irvin Row Memorial Pilot Lounge built. In addition, he built two (2) hangars at the Smithville-Crawford Municipal Airport and another five (5) hangars at the Fayette Regional Airport in La Grange; and

WHEREAS, being a part of the "Greatest Generation", Bennie Lueders was not afraid of hard work. Bennie had many successful endeavors including a vacuum cleaner salesman, shipyard welder, pipeline welder, riding stable owner, charter boat fishing captain, marina owner, and real estate developer. Winding out his career, Bennie moved back to the Smithville in early 1980's where he built a car wash, a used car lot, and developed the Oak Meadow subdivision. However, his greatest passion, besides his family, was music; and

WHEREAS, during the 40's, 50's, and 60's Bennie played in several bands, Jimmy Dean for one, and played back-up for various recording artists like Dottie West. He had his own band (Benny Leaders & His Western Rangers), recordings, and radio program. At one time or another his band members included such stars like actor-singer Tommy Sands, Grand Old Opry star Hank Locklin, Rock-a-Billy Hall of Fame member Link Davis, and Herb Remington, developer of the Remington Steel guitar; and

WHEREAS, Bennie Lueders was inducted into the Texas Western Swing Hall of Fame in 2019;

WHEREAS, Bennie Lueders was married to Mary Lueders for 53-years with 2 daughters, 7 grandkids, and 17 great-grandkids who passed on April 23, 2023, at the age of 95; and

Councilwoman Barrientos made a motion to approve the 25' front yard variance, the 24.2 west side yard variance, the 14' Eastside yard variance, minimum lot size of 4,051 sq ft instead of 15,000 sq ft, allowing 76% coverage instead of 70%, off-street parking to go from six to two, and open space to go from 30% to 24% the variance is not contrary to the public interest, and there are special conditions affecting the applicant's property; and because of the special conditions, literal enforcement of the ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship; and the variance observes the spirit of the ordinance, and substantial justice is done. Councilwoman Bruno seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

b) On a variance request for the masonry wall or equivalent noise attenuating barrier addition site design standard for the Highway Commercial Dist. For Property ID 8717857, property owner George McMahan, Agent Ronnye Kettler: Family Dollar /

Dollar Tree is requesting a variance to allow a wooden fence instead of a masonry wall as a noise attenuating barrier to separate commercial from residential use.

Councilwoman Barrientos made a motion to approve the variance for a 6ft wooden fence and require the deed restrictions will be in place for a second fence for the subdivision beside this property, the variance is not contrary to the public interest, and there are special conditions affecting the applicant's property; and because of the special conditions, literal enforcement of the ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship; and the variance observes the spirit of the ordinance, and substantial justice is done. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a Resolution Responding to the Application of CenterPoint Energy Resources Corp., South Texas Division, to Increase Rates Under the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program (GRIP) Suspending the Effective Date of this Rate Application for Forty-Five (45) Days: Under Texas law (re: Gas Utilities Regulatory Act), we do not have the ability to oppose the rate increase. However, we can postpone the effective date of the proposed increase for 45-days. The rate will be increased by \$3.72/month for residential service and \$7.51/month for small commercial service. The adjusted monthly charge (base rate) will be \$30.75 and \$48.93 respectively. This represents an average increase between 13-18%. The rate increase will help recover incremental spending for capital infrastructure improvements in its South Texas Division during the 2023 calendar year. The proposed IRA will become effective on May 1, 2023 unless the City approves the resolution to suspend the IRA effective date until June 15, 2023. Councilman Etheredge made a motion to approve suspending the rate until June 15th. Councilwoman Bruno seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a Resolution Awarding the Home Grant construction contract – In accordance with TDHCA rules, the City published a bid request for the construction of the homes listed below:

- 203 Cleveland Base Bid \$150,000
- 203 Washington Base Bid \$148,200
- 611 Gazley Base bid \$148,200
- 415 Gazley Base Bid \$148,200

The bid opening was held at City Hall (317 Main) on February 16, 2023 at 9:00 A.M. One (1) bid was received from RM Quality Construction, LLC (dba Randy Malouf Builder). RM Quality Construction, LLC has built multiple HOME Program houses in and around central Texas including Smithville. Councilman Gordon made a motion to award RM Quality Construction, LLC. the bid Councilwoman Morgan seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Discussion and Action on a Resolution Endorsing HB 2717 that would limit train length in Texas: Approving this resolution will officially communicate the City's support of HB 2717

sponsored by District 143 Representative Ana Hernandez. If passed, HB 2717 would establish a maximum length of 8,500' for any train operating in Texas. It is not uncommon to have trains in excess of 10,000 ft coming through Smithville while parents are dropping off and/or picking-up school aged children resulting in gridlocked traffic and excessive delays along Hwy 95 and Loop 230. Not to mention cutting off all available routes for emergency personnel between the south and north side(s) of our community. Councilman Gordon made a motion to approve the resolution. Councilman Etheredge seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: None

Discussion and Action on a Resolution for Broadband: Approving this resolution will officially communicate the City's support of HB 9 sponsored by District 9 Representative Trent Ashby. If passed, HB 9 would develop broadband telecommunications services through an appropriation of public funds. Smithville clearly needs to address Broadband as an economic development issue as our rural community is still underserviced by broadband providers. A number of federal agencies provide funds connected to grant/loan projects and programs that could be of use in Smithville. Several businesses, nonprofit organizations, and governmental entities have been coalescing to be ready to build broadband infrastructure once needs and funding sources are more clearly identified and once champions come to the fore. The City of Smithville intends to work with the Smithville Workforce Training Center, Bastrop County, BCC, and other local partners to ensure that our community is included in this effort. Councilwoman Morgan made a motion to approve the resolution. Councilman Etheredge seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: None

Discussion and Action on an Ordinance Amending Ordinance 9903-334 to Correctly include the alley in Block 10, Mount Pleasant Addition as being closed, vacated, and abandoned: This ordinance amendment is being presented to address a clerical error regarding a request to abandon an alley in Block 10, Mount Pleasant Addition. The owner of the property, Patsy Rae Caldwell (deceased) submitted the request to abandon the alley to Bob Miller (City Manager) in 1999. All other streets and alleys surrounding this property were abandoned by the City. Councilman Etheredge made a motion to approve the Ordinance Amendment to include the alley of Block 10. Councilwoman Morgan seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: Leigh Kilgore said it's her opinion that if you have a group of people the know the ordinances and come to the meetings and have a quorum the P&Z doesn't need to go to seven.

Discussion and Possible Action on Changes to the Planning and Zoning Commission: Councilmember Etheredge is proposing to expand the P&Z Commission from 5 to 7 members and update language to clarify qualifications, roles, and responsibilities. There was discussion among the Council about having subject matter expertise on the board, making sure the board knew the rules and procedures, senior officials at the P&Z meeting, and the P&Z would stay at five members not go to seven. Councilman Etheredge asked Robert to make changes to the ordinance and incorporate anything he thought should be incorporated and bring it back to the council at a later council meeting for discussion and action.

Discussion and Action on a Resolution Authorizing the Submission of the Grant Application for the "Truancy Prevention Through Mentorship at the Gardens" to the Office of the Governor: Councilwoman Barrientos made a motion to approve the Resolution. Discussion and Action on the Annual Audit for the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year Budget: Jack Clark the City Auditor couldn't make the meeting tonight so this item was postponed until the May 15, 2023 Council Meeting.

Discussion and Action on renewing an agreement between the City of Smithville and PHI Air Medical to provide air ambulance service to the citizens of Smithville: The City of Smithville is considering renewing its contract agreement with PHI Air Medical to provide "no cost" emergency medical air transport of citizens with life-threatening injuries / illnesses that reside within the Smithville City Limits. The proposed annual fee of \$12,411 is based on providing coverage to approximately 1773 households (an increase of 68 additional households as identified by the most current list of residential utility customers). The plan will cover all Smithville citizens while they are in PHI Service Area (i.e., Bastrop County) at a cost of \$7.00 per household. For those citizens with insurance (including Medicare patients), the agreement will cover all co-pays, deductibles, and remaining balances for PHI transports. For those without insurance, the agreement will cover payment in full. For those citizens on Medicaid, PHI will receive a payment from the state. Citizens can upgrade to a full national household membership for \$30 per year (\$15 reduction from last year's \$45 rate) that will provide coverage outside of the Bastrop County service area. If approved, the contract will be valid through April 30, 2024. Councilwoman Morgan made a motion to approve the contract with PHI Air Medical. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: None

Discussion and Action on awarding the Airport Hay contract: The City of Smithville published Request for Proposals (RFP) in the Austin American Statesman on March 15, 2023 and March 22, 2023 seeking a contractor for the exclusive right to cut and bale hay at the Smithville-Crawford Municipal Airport (located at 765 NW Loop 230). Two (2) contractors submitted sealed proposals that were opened and read aloud in the City Council Chambers at 10:15 am on April 3, 2023. John Badders Farm and Ranching Services submitted a bid to pay the City of Smithville \$2,100 per year for the 2-year contract. **Hurta Cattle Company** submitted a bid for \$6,053 per year for the 2-year contract. Councilwoman Morgan made a motion to award Hurta Cattle Company the Airport Hay contract. Councilwoman Bruno seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: None

Discussion and Action on replacing Faith Franklin on the Historical Preservation and Design Standards Board with LeRoy Behrens: The Historic Preservation and Design Standards Advisory Committee (HPDSAC) is a nine (9) member committee appointed by the Mayor. Three (3) members are selected by the following organizations to participate on the committee: Heritage Society, Chamber of Commerce, and Cultural District. Six (6) members are selected "at-large' from the community. The membership term is 2-years concurrent with the election of the Mayor. Councilwoman Bruno made a motion to approve the resignation of Faith Franklin and the appointment of LeRoy Behrens. Councilwoman Morgan seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: None

Discussion and Action on an Ordinance amending Article 3.04 Floodplain Management: The new FEMA Flood Plain Maps have been published and need to be adopted by ordinance on or before May 9, 2023. State legislation requires all cities and counties to adopt ordinances or orders to become eligible to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Councilman Etheredge made a motion to approve the ordinance to reflect the new flood maps. Councilman Gordon seconded and the motion passed unanimously.





Planning and Zoning Variance Criteria: Ordinance and Request for Variance

Ordinance Related to Variances 5.1.1. Considerations by the City Council

- A. The City Council may authorize a variance from these regulations if and only if the City Council determines all of the following:
 - (1) the variance will not be contrary to the public interest;
 - (2) there are special conditions affecting the property;
 - (3) because of the special conditions literal enforcement of the ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship;
 - (4) the spirit of the ordinance will be observed; and
 - (5) substantial justice is done.





To the Mayor and Members of the City Council Of the City of Smithville, Texas

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of City of Smithville, Texas for the year ended September 30, 2022. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards (and, if applicable, *Government Auditing Standards* and the Uniform Guidance), as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our letter to you dated May 6, 2022. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Opinion on the Financial Statements

The primary purpose of a financial audit is for the auditor to render an opinion as to whether the financial statements of the audited organization appear to be free from material misstatement and adhere to generally accepted accounting principles. This opinion must be based on a systematic review of the evidence supporting the financial statement amounts. In conjunction with the audit, the auditor must also consider internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion on internal control.

Our opinion on the financial statements appears within the Independent Auditor's Report on page 1 of the Annual Financial Report. This opinion is classified as *Unmodified*.

Significant Audit Matters

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by City of Smithville, Texas are described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

During the year the City implemented Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 87 - Leases (GASB 87) which brought significant changes to the accounting treatment for leases. GASB 87 increases the usefulness of governmental financial statements by requiring recognition of certain lease assets and liabilities for all leases, including those that previously were classified as operating leases. This new standard replaces the previous lease accounting methodology and establishes a single model for lease accounting based on the foundational principle that leases are a financing of the right to use an underlying asset.

We noted no transactions entered into by City of Smithville, Texas during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimates affecting the City of Smithville, Texas's financial statements were:

Management's estimate of the net pension liability and other post-employment liabilities is based on actuarial studies of the pension and post-employment benefit plans prepared by independent actuaries contracted by the respective plan. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used within these actuarial studies in determining that the resulting net pension liability and other post-employment benefit liability are reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Management's estimate of current year and accumulated depreciation on long-term capital assets is based on the historical cost of these assets and estimates of their useful lives. We evaluated the recorded asset values, estimated useful lives, and accumulated depreciation amounts to determine that they appear reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

The financial statement disclosures appear to be neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements. In addition, none of the misstatements detected as a result of audit procedures and corrected by management were material, either individually or in the aggregate, to each opinion unit's financial statements taken as a whole.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated March 3, 2023.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to City of Smithville, Texas's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Fund Balance of the General Fund

The General Fund is the main operating fund of the City and contains the primary financial resources available to provide for ongoing City operations. The ending fund balance level of the General Fund is therefore a good indicator of the financial health of the City. A commonly accepted best practice for fund balance is to maintain an ending fund balance level of at least 25% of annual noncapital General Fund expenditures. As of September 30, 2022, the fund balance of the General Fund was \$1,337,125 in total, which represented 23% of noncapital General Fund expenditures for the year.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as City of Smithville, Texas's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

Audit Findings, Internal Control, and Compliance Related Matters

Government Auditing Standards and the federal Uniform Guidance require an auditor to report material weaknesses and significant deficiencies found in the internal control of an organization, as well as material noncompliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements.

A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A regular deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet potentially more consequential than a regular deficiency and important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Material noncompliance with provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements occurs when the noncompliance is to a large enough degree that there could be a material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts or consequences severe enough to potentially affect the organization's operations.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards and the federal Uniform Guidance, the following summarized audit finding has been reported as a result of our audit. This matter is provided in more detail, along with management planned corrective action, in the Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs and Corrective Action Plan sections of the Annual Financial Report.

2022-001 Texas Bid Law Compliance

During the year, the City made purchases in excess of \$50,000 in aggregate to three vendors without using a competitive purchasing method, resulting in technical noncompliance with Texas bid law. We recommend that the City plan large purchases in advance to ensure they are made through competitive means.

Other Matters

We applied certain limited procedures to the management's discussion and analysis section preceding the financial statements and the pension and post-employment benefit liability schedules that follow the notes to the financial statements, which are required supplementary information (RSI) that supplements the basic financial statements. Our procedures consisted of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We did not audit the RSI and do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI.

We were engaged to report on other supplementary information such as the combining statements and the schedule of expenditures of federal awards, which accompany the financial statements but are not RSI. With respect to this supplementary information, we made certain inquiries of management and evaluated the form, content, and methods of preparing the information to determine that the information complies with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the method of preparing it has not changed from the prior period, and the information is appropriate and complete in relation to our audit of the financial statements. We compared and reconciled the supplementary information to the underlying accounting records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves.

This information is intended solely for the information and use of the governing body and management of City of Smithville, Texas and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SMITHVILLE TO AMEND RATES OF CITY PARK RENTALS AND THE CITY WOULD LIKE TO UPDATE THE MASTER FEE SCHEDULE ATTACHED AS EXHIBIT "A" PROVIDING THAT OTHER FEES NOT LISTED BUT NOW CHARGED PURSUANT TO OTHER ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL TRANSFERRED TO THE MASTER FEE SCHEDULE BY AMENDMENT; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE: PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City finds it necessary to regularly review and bring current, fees, and assessments charged by the City of Smithville; and

SECTION I.
