HPDS Advisory Committee Public Meeting Minutes

December 18, 2019

<u>Call to Order:</u> The open meeting of this Committee was called to order at 5:30pm by Carol Snyder in the City Council Chambers in City Hall.

<u>Certificate of Appropriateness List:</u> Jill Strube circulated a list of previously approved Certificates of Appropriateness, some of which were administratively approved because they mainly had to do with film activities in town and were temporary in nature.

<u>COA Applicant Presentation:</u> Walter Winslett, business owner, made a brief presentation about the history of his building and for the application of a mosaic for the side of his building, <u>Mosaic</u>. The artist, Stephanie DeStephano, was present to explain her proposed project and to answer any questions from the committee members and audience. She stated that

- the proposed mosaic of local artist Hannibal Lokumbe would be approximately 20.5' x 32' in a wooden frame and that it would be attached to the building "by whatever mastic/adhesive would be good for the building itself." David Harrington and Caroline Noya had specifically asked about this.;
- 2.) the materials used in the mosaic were going to be tiles (handmade and commercial) and mirror;
- 3.) it would be a self-sustaining piece and there would be no need to clean it (not a burden for the City or business owner to maintain). She would include a plaque to explain the story of the mural, which members thought would be helpful.
- 4.) Questions posed were about
 - a.) how the mural would be attached to the building by whatever mastic/product is necessary/available or even bolted to the side of the building,
 - b.) how it would affect the integrity of the building it will not. Could be in a frame and attached by bolts or other product so as not to affect the building's structural integrity.,
 - c.) whether or not the mirrors used in the mural might affect any nearby tenants or drivers when the sun/headlights of vehicles hit it at different times of the day this will not likely be a problem as the mosaic will be on the North side of the structure, but "it can be fixed if it is a problem.".
 - d.) if the building gets sold at a later date, what would happen to the mosaic art piece? That will be a decision between the new owner and the artist to discuss. It could be removed or it could stay in place. The artist owns the piece.
- 5.) <u>Comments</u>: Carol Snyder read an e-mail from absent committee member, Sarah O'Brien, in support of the mural. City Manager was present and was in support of the project.
- 6.) Motion: Nancy Cathermann moved that the proposed project be approved. April Daniels seconded. Motion voted on and passed by Committee members. Carol Snyder will recommend approval to the City Council at 1/13/2020 City Council meeting.

<u>COA Form:</u> A discussion was held regarding some changes to the COA form. The Lessee has been informed; the building owner <u>must</u> sign the form, the business owner <u>could</u> sign but that would be between the landlord and tenant. If anyone has further comments, please let Jill Strube know!

<u>Adjournment:</u> With no further business, April Daniels moved, Caroline Noya seconded, that the meeting be adjourned at 6:05pm.
